We also celebrated VE Day with a display and a focus on celebrating our past.

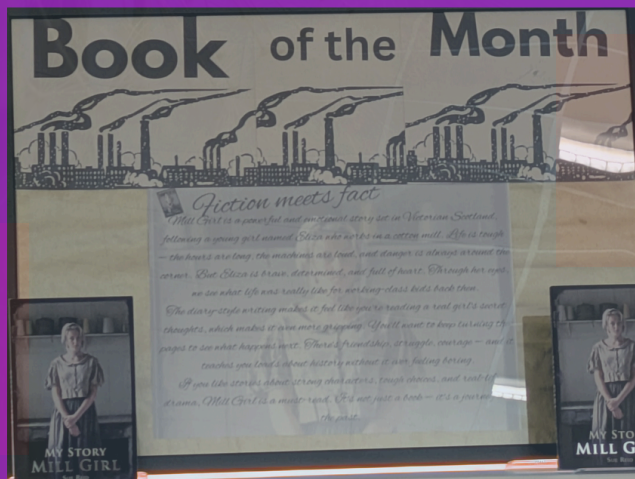

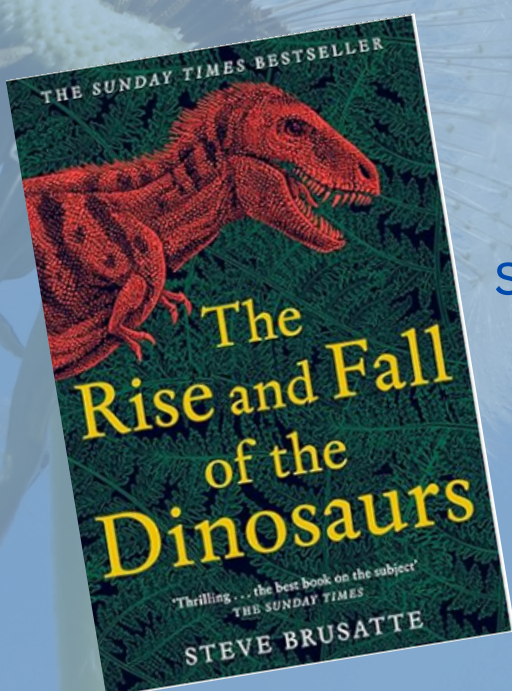
New Books
