



Cycling to school – Policy

Fred Longworth High School is keen to encourage cycling and walking to school to promote healthy and environmentally friendly lifestyles and to help to reduce congestion at busy times before and after school. However cycling to school is potentially very dangerous and as a school we want to ensure that we are doing all that we can to promote safe cycling and to minimise the associated risks with cycling to school. We need the support of parents in implementing this policy; parents play a key role in ensuring that their sons and daughters cooperate with the school's policy on cycling to school.

In order to minimise risks to our students we have a policy which is based around safe cycling.

Cycling to School Contract

1. All bicycles must be roadworthy and appropriate for the age of the student in terms of frame size and seat height. All bikes must have brakes that work safely. Parents will ensure that their child's bike is safe and roadworthy.
2. Students are not permitted to travel to school on e-bikes or e-scooters.
3. We strongly advise students to wear a helmet when cycling to and from school. The school will provide an area to store helmets during lesson times.
4. When students are on school site, they must dismount their bike and walk the bike to the cycle storage area.
5. Students will ensure that they provide a lock for their bike to be secured on school grounds in the bike storage areas.
6. During the winter months when cycling to and from school in the dark, parents will ensure that students' bikes have front and rear lights.
7. All students will cycle in a safe manner and take into account pedestrians and other school children.

8. All students will refrain from listening to music through earphones whilst cycling to school.
9. Students who are found to be cycling dangerously will be spoken to about their unsafe cycling and permission to cycle to school may be withdrawn.
10. If a student continues to bring their bike to school despite being banned, we will lock the student's bike up, and parents will be required to attend a meeting in school.
11. Parents who need to discuss issues with cycling to school will contact the relevant Head of Year or Mr Fallows, Pastoral Leader.
