Fred Longworth High School is a large 11-16, mixed comprehensive school with 1300 students on roll. The school was graded 'good' in its last inspection (November 2017).

We are seeking to appoint an inspirational leader with the drive and commitment to lead our successful Humanities Faculty. The Faculty is comprised of eleven members of staff. The Faculty already benefits from excellent facilities but the successful applicant will be joining the school at an exciting and significant time. Later this year, work will start on the complete rebuild of our school, which will ensure that you will be working in state of the art facilities.

The appointed person will teach History across all age and ability ranges and be responsible for the leadership and development of the History Curriculum at KS3 and KS4. At KS4, we offer EDEXCEL GCSE History. History is a very popular option choice and the highest performing subject in school. The wider Humanities Faculty has gone from strength to strength in recent years. As Head of Faculty, you will have the opportunity to build on these strengths, supported by a committed and dedicated team. You will be responsible for overseeing the wider Humanities curriculum areas. You will be assisted by an Assistant Head of Faculty (who leads the Geography curriculum) and other post holders who lead Religious Studies, Sociology and Health and Social Care. In this role you will gain significant leadership experience to enhance your leadership qualities.

You will also be part of a highly supportive and committed team of other Heads of Faculty who play an active and significant part in the development and leadership of the school.

- A strong leader with a high level of emotional intelligence who has the ability to offer colleagues within the Faculty the right balance of challenge and support.
- Willing to develop yourself as a teacher and as a leader.
- Proficient in terms of ICT skills and learning strategies and their role in the delivery of good quality Humanities lessons.
- Passionate about teaching students the Humanities and have an interest in curriculum innovation and development.
- Able to work under pressure and plan the use of time.
- Willing to work closely with the other members of the Faculty in terms of planning.

- Assessment procedures in relation to the History National Curriculum and at GCSE.
- Matters related to effective monitoring of achievement in History.
- Supporting the other Humanities subjects in relation to the development of curriculum and assessment.
